










## Fuel type market share










# Market Health – European Retail Price Index







The price index shows the indexed average movement of the absolute price of all vehicles on offer. We control for vehicle-specific factors, like make, model, age, mileage and optional equipment. We control for changes in basket composition over time as well as aging of the vehicle over time. How to read: if the index moves from 1 to 0.99 in one week on average you would need to pay 1% less for the same vehicle than the week before.

# Market Health UK Price Index by age








## **Launch Report:** Volkswagen ID.4



### Strengths

The Volkswagen (VW) ID.4 is a very good, likeable fully-electric SUV that is arguably much more appealing than its smaller sibling, the ID.3, in terms of looks, value and usability. Launched in 'First Edition' trim with a price tag of just over £37,000 (after factoring in the government's £3,000 incentive), it will interest many company-car drivers. The interior is modern and airy, with decent build quality. Depending on the variant, driving range is around 215 to 320 claimed miles, which should cover most needs. The car is practical enough, with room for five adults and a boot capacity of 543 litres, so should fit most needs.

**Opportunities** The car will obviously add yet another fully-electric vehicle to VW's line-up. This will help with the manufacturer's CO2 emissions targets, as well as its aims of becoming a greener manufacturer with a lower carbon footprint. There is also strong demand currently for BEV company cars in the UK due to the taxation benefits, so the vehicle will help fulfil that demand and get volumes into the market. There will obviously be cheaper versions arriving soon and after the government grant, the starting price will be very close to £30,000. This represents decent value and prices the vehicle within range of existing

Tiguan diesel customers.

## Weaknesses


Like all battery-electric vehicles (BEVs), the ID.4 has limitations, such as the useable range and the time it takes to recharge the battery. However, if selected sensibly, and range and charging time is properly considered, the vehicle should be easy enough to live with for most people. There is a mindset change, but most people will not use the full range in a day. Owners can then just use their home-charging point to top it up each evening - or every other evening. depending on use.

### **Threats**

Like all BEVs, there are concerns about where they will fit into the used-car market once they start to come back in any volume. Currently, the demand for BEVs comes predominantly from company-car drivers due to the tax benefits, but where are the incentives in the used-car market? There remains a large price gap between internal combustion engine (ICE) vehicles and BEVs and it is difficult to see why a used-car buyer would choose to spend far more money on an electric model unless they really want one.
